



Nothing is more a part of everyday life than the air we breathe. Most of us don't give it a second thought, but we couldn't survive without it. And when the quality of the air around us suffers, our health does too.


Although the air in the Omaha-Council Bluffs metro appears relatively clean, health studies have shown that levels of ground-level ozone — an odorless, colorless air pollutant — continue to be a health hazard in our area, and come close to exceeding the EPA's unacceptable, or "non-attainment" level, especially on hot summer days.

Little Steps Cleaner Air is a community-wide campaign focused on the idea that each of us has the power to help reduce ground-level ozone and improve our air quality.

Managed by the Metropolitan Area Planning Agency (MAPA), and funded by grants from the Federal Highway Administration and the Nebraska Environmental Trust, Little Steps Cleaner Air offers easy ways for all area residents to do their part.




## **Word Match**

Think of the Air Quality Index (AQI) as a yardstick that runs from 0 to 500. The higher the AQI value, the greater the level of air pollution and the greater the health concern.

The EPA has assigned a specific color to each AQI value to make it easier for people to understand quickly whether air pollution is reaching unhealthy levels in their communities.






